GMU—JSFC PATH Program-

George Mason University School of Nursing embarked on a five year program Mason PATH is a faculty practice plan that includes nurse practitioners providing primary and mental health care, nurse educators providing patient education and nurse researchers evaluating clinical and behavioral outcomes.

In addition, the five-year grant offers graduate and undergraduate nursing students opportunities for service-

learning experiences. Through this one-of-a-kind partnership, Mason faculty members provide services to JSFC patients every Friday, functioning as a clinic-within-a-clinic.



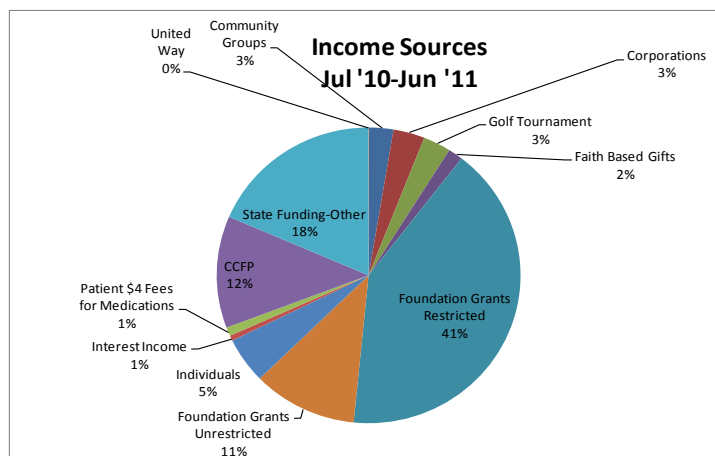
Community Connections- With JSFC's move to the Connections for Hope location in January of 2010 we experienced a surge in requests for services due to heightened visibility. This increase in demand, coupled with a move toward integrating **mental health services** into the clinic created the Clinic Community Connections project. Funded by Boeing Employees fund and the Giving Circle the program provides increased hourly staff hours to move part-time positions to full time schedules and hire a licensed professional counselor. The role of these staff members is to increase our ability to provide casework and mental health services, while managing referrals to other safety net service providers.

Service

The clinic continues to provide services to uninsured patients with incomes 200% or less of the federal poverty level. Children's services include non-emergency medical care, health screenings, school and sports physicals, medications, specialty referrals, and vision screenings. Services for adults with high blood pressure and diabetes include full primary medical care with preventative screenings, prescription medicines, health education, diagnostic testing, specialty referrals and repeat visits with a medical provider.

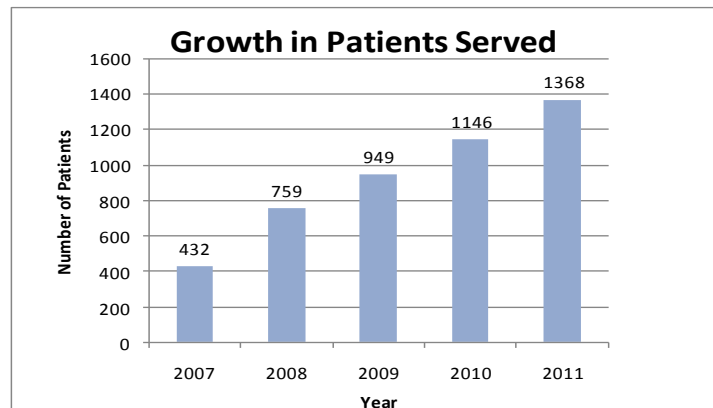

Providing Tools for Patients to Improve their Health

Access to provider visits, screenings, diagnostic testing, medications, health education and specific care plans have a direct impact on our patients health with dramatic consequences. For patients with the clinic more than 6 months:

- 95% of patients with hypertension had a decrease in blood pressure.
- 100% of children received screenings needed for sports of school enrollment.
- 77% of diabetic patients saw a decrease in their A1c.
- 100% of patients were provided medically necessary medications.
- 43% of diabetic patients received individual or group diabetes education classes.

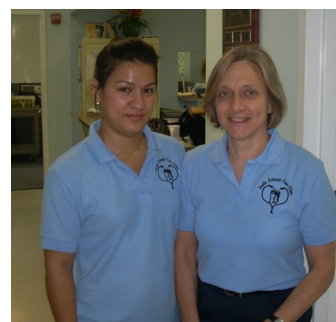
