
Books In Their Hands



What is the organization aiming to accomplish?

The Jane Addams Peace Association is looking to expand the Books In Their Hands program through increasing partnerships with libraries and schools in addition to supporting dialogue with students about social justice, equity and peace. In addition, we are looking to broaden the awareness of the Jane Addams Children's Book Award, the only social justice book award in the country.

What are the organization's key strategies for making this happen?

- -Expand Books In their Hands programs to reach over 1,000 students annually.
- -Increase awareness of the Jane Addams Book Award Authors so teachers can incorporate these books in their curriculum.
- -Add more curriculum study guides for these books so teachers can easily access and incorporate with the books in their curriculum
- -Partner with more libraries and publishers to expand the reach of Books In their Hands, allowing more students to receive a copy of their book and receive a visit from an award-winning author dedicated to social justice, peace and equity

What are the organization's capabilities for doing this?

- -We reached 1,000 students in 2023 and believe with continued development efforts to financially support this work we can reach
- -We have created study guides o pair with our author visits to engage students in thoughtful dialogue on social justice, peace, and equity.
- -We have already established partnerships with three libraries and have partnered with five publishers to offer a discounted rate on the books.

What have and haven't they accomplished so far?

- -We reached 1,00 students in 2023 and have some partnerships setup in the pipeline for 2024.
- -We renewed three foundation grants in 2023.
- -We have expanded our outreach to several conferences, social groups, et cetera.
- -We increased our donors in 2023 from 2022.
- -We have partnered with three libraries in 2023.



- -The <u>IRS Business Master File</u> lists approximately 1.7 million nonprofits registered with the IRS as tax-exempt organizations.
- -The <u>IRS Automatic Revocation of Exemption List</u> contains organizations that have had their federal tax-exempt status automatically revoked for failing to file an annual return or notice with the IRS for three consecutive years
- -The Foundation Status Code is a value derived by mapping the codes found on the <u>990PF filing instructions</u> to the corresponding codes in the IRS BMF. Note that not all codes are able to be mapped due to insufficient data.
- -The Office of Foreign Assets Control (OFAC) <u>Specially Designated Nationals (SDN) list</u> organizations that are owned or controlled by targeted individuals, groups, and entities, such as terrorists or narcotics traffickers. Their assets are blocked and U.S. persons are generally prohibited from dealing with them.
