Launched in 2018, our Community Grants are focused on improving wetlands and wildlife habitat and sustaining functional flows.



Our goal is simple: keep rivers flowing. There are many projects are in the works right now, including stream-side restoration in Utah, improved habitat for the endangered Southwestern Willow Flycatcher in Arizona and enhanced wetland function in Colorado.

What are the organization's key strategies for making this happen?

The people behind Forever Our Rivers are entrepreneurs and connectors, creatively working to impact river health through the development of broad-based and sustainable revenue streams.

What are the organization's capabilities for doing this?

We now have two staff members and are actively working to expand our board.

Ann joins Forever Our Rivers after 15 years in land and water conservation. During her tenure as executive director of Crested Butte Land Trust, the organization tripled its operating capacity and achieved national accreditation. She completed several award-winning river restoration projects and was instrumental in bringing together diverse viewpoints to resolve a 30-year conflict over the use and protection of Snodgrass Mountain. Ann later served as the Russian River program manager for the Sonoma Land Trust. She was responsible for creating a land and water conservation strategy to protect the natural processes of the river while meeting social and economic needs. Ann is serving her second term as commissioner for the Land Trust Accreditation Commission. Within the commission, Ann serves on the Governance Committee. Prior to that, she served an appointment by Colorado's governor to the Conservation Easement Oversight Commission.

GuideStar Charity Check Data Sources

-GuideStar acquires all IRS data directly from the Internal Revenue Service.

-<u>IRS Publication 78 (Cumulative List of Organizations)</u> lists organizations that have been recognized by the Internal Revenue Service as eligible to receive tax-deductible contributions.

- -The <u>IRS Internal Revenue Bulletin</u> (IRB) lists changes in charitable status since the last Publication 78 release. Between the release of IRS Publication 78 and the subsequent IRS Internal Revenue Bulletin, the IRB date will reflect the most recent release date of IRS Publication 78.
- -The $\underline{\sf IRS}$ Business Master File lists approximately 1.7 million nonprofits registered with the IRS as tax-exempt organizations.
- -The <u>IRS Automatic Revocation of Exemption List</u> contains organizations that have had their federal tax-exempt status automatically revoked for failing to file an annual return or notice with the IRS for three consecutive years
- -The Foundation Status Code is a value derived by mapping the codes found on the <u>990PF filling instructions</u> to the corresponding codes in the IRS BMF. Note that not all codes are able to be mapped due to insufficient data.
- -The Office of Foreign Assets Control (OFAC) <u>Specially Designated Nationals (SDN) list</u> organizations that are owned or controlled by targeted individuals, groups, and entities, such as terrorists or narcotics traffickers. Their assets are blocked and U.S. persons are generally prohibited from dealing with them.
