Empowerment Program for Middle School Girls

Population(s) Served:

Children and youth (0-19 years)

We run empowerment workshops, as well as afterschool fitness and triathlon-specific training sessions, for middle school girls in 10 school districts across Suffolk County. We also hold nutrition classes for the girls and their families.

CHARTING IMPACT

What is the organization aiming to accomplish?

i-tri is an empowerment program for middle school girls, based on the East End of Long Island. As we enter our 13th program year, we will be doing so with a focus on the psychological needs faced by adolescent girls as they return to in-person learning.

Problem Statement

i-tri addresses mental and physical health challenges, and social and racial inequities unique to adolescent girls, that have gone largely unmet. Serving 200 middle school girls annually, ages 11 to 14, in grades 6 to 8, who attend one of 13 partner schools. Our girls are: Latina (54%); White (24%) Black (14%) and Asian, Native American or Other (8%). Nearly 70%, experience food or housing insecurity; 50% are eligible for free or reduced lunch; and 45% come from divorced or single parent households. Many experience childhood trauma which places them at risk for poor mental health outcomes and limited socioeconomic opportunities throughout their lives (Centers for Disease Control).

What are the organization's key strategies for making this happen?

i-tri will engage with The Center for Healing & Justice Through Sport to work with the staff and board of i-tri to integrate trauma-informed/healing centered practices into all aspects of program and organizational operations, creating a culture of Trauma-Informed Coaching in our organization. In addition to training our Board and Staff, we will be hosting a community forum to introduce the concept of Trauma-Informed Coaching to stakeholders in the 12 East End school districts we serve. (Administrators, Athletic Directors, Coaches, Youth Sports coordinators, etc.)

What are the organization's capabilities for doing this?

Since 2010, i-tri has worked with over 1000 underserved girls across the East End of Long Island, teaching them that they are CAPABLE, BRAVE and STRONG! i-tri uses the sport of triathlon as a metaphor for life's journey... setting goals, facing fears and adversity and ultimately crossing the finish line of a youth-distance triathlon. The program is offered free of charge to all participants.

What have and haven't they accomplished so far?

Independent evaluations conducted annually, reveal that as a result of the i-tri program, between 85% to 100% of our participants make the following gains:

- ■ 100% completed the triathlon
- •■ 100% demonstrated positive changes in eating habits
- •■ 98% experienced growth in one or more SEL categories: positive identify; social capital; and/or social skills
- •■ 90% demonstrated significant increases in fitness levels
- 85% experienced growth in additional SEL categories: self-confidence; goal orientation, and/or social connections.



- -The Foundation Status Code is a value derived by mapping the codes found on the <u>990PF filing instructions</u> to the corresponding codes in the IRS BMF. Note that not all codes are able to be mapped due to insufficient data.
- -The Office of Foreign Assets Control (OFAC) <u>Specially Designated Nationals (SDN) list</u> organizations that are owned or controlled by targeted individuals, groups, and entities, such as terrorists or narcotics traffickers. Their assets are blocked and U.S. persons are generally prohibited from dealing with them.
