Due to the disruption caused by the pandemic during the 2020-2021 school year, TEA waived the requirement that Program Improvement Plans (PIPs) be developed if the contracted number of case-managed students and/or Academics, Behavior and Attendance (ABA) Student Goal Performance Metrics were not met.

If you see any discrepancies in the above data, please let us know as soon as possible.

For reference, the total case-managed students served statewide in 2020-2021 was **98,285** students on **1,245** campuses. The statewide outcomes for the 2020-2021 school year were:

- **58%** of CMS Targeted Statewide for **ACADEMICS - 89% Improved**
- **66%** of CMS Targeted Statewide for **BEHAVIOR - 82% Improved**
- **19%** of CMS Targeted Statewide for **ATTENDANCE - 76% Improved**
- **97%** of CMS Statewide were **PROMOTED**
- **92%** of Eligible CMS Statewide **GRADUATED**
- **99%** of CMS Statewide **STAYED IN SCHOOL**

We want to thank you for your contributions to achieve these outcomes. It was a challenging year for everyone, and we are grateful for all you have done to support students' success.
