*During this past year, we increased the number of childcare provider training sites and assisted childcare providers through professional development and quality improvements. We expanded our services for parents and are now serving families through weekly sessions in the cities of Dearborn, Detroit, Eastpointe, Hamtramck and Warren. As a part of the federally-sponsored Social Innovation Fund our agency, partnering with four others and the United Way for Southeastern Michigan, provides family-guided case management and services in south Macomb County and Detroit.*

*Unfortunately, it also is the worst of times. Communities in California, Florida, Puerto Rico and Texas have experienced devastating natural disasters. Violence has impacted many. The academic, economic and social needs of children in our region remain extensive. And funding cuts and changes in funding priorities are constantly limiting our ability to respond.*

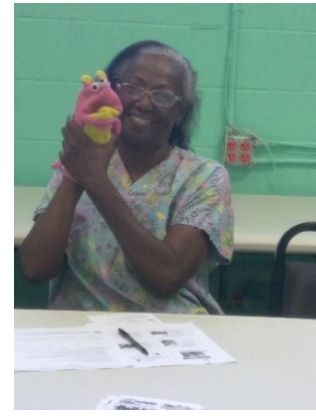
# 2017 Annual Report Highlights

## Continuing To Make A Difference In Early Childhood

Over the past year, Leaps & Bounds staff and associates have worked tirelessly to make a difference across Metro Detroit. The agency has supplied families with winter gloves, hats, emergency food orders and baby supplies and distributed 940 of these and other essential items. The agency held interactive learning groups with 458 adults and their children, helping to build their skills in math and reading while fostering further parent/child interaction. The agency has donated 1,200 new books to children across Metro Detroit, and completed 1,649 home visits to 125 children ages five and under, helping to provide support and needed information on childcare and pediatric wellness to at-risk homes and families.

## Continuing To Support Community Caregivers

The agency's Early Learning Communities have lent a helping hand to home and center-based childcare providers across Detroit and Warren. The agency aids these caregivers with free training in child development, free learning materials and access to free family and community events. 186 childcare providers received quality improvement support through our participation, and over 21,000 hours of training, assistance, and technical support has been provided to local caregivers. The agency held a focused training series for childcare professionals seeking national certification, and over the past year 37 such individuals have completed this five-month series.



## Continuing To Bolster Our Communities

Throughout this past year the agency has continued to participate in many collaborative efforts aimed at helping children and at-risk families throughout Metro Detroit. The agency has participated in events and initiatives in cooperation with Great Start Wayne, Great Start Macomb, United Way for Southeast Michigan's Regional Early Learning Community, and the tri-county Quality Improvement Advisory Committee. Over the course of nine community events, resources and activities have been provided for 600 adults and their children, and books have been distributed at each event.



## Continuing Our Commitment To Financial Responsibility

Any charitable contribution is put to effective use. The agency will be ending this year within its approved operating budget thanks to conservative and responsible fiscal management. Sources of revenue include financial support from United Way, state and county contracts, investments, special events, and general donations from readers like you. We are committed to keeping our sources of revenue diverse and we maintain a strong reserve of funds for the future ahead.

### New Grant Provides Enhanced Services!

The agency, in collaboration with United Way for Southeastern Michigan and other area non-profits, has been awarded a three-year Social Innovation Fund grant from the federal government. This project will use case management, assessments, the Family Check Up model and integration into other agency services for families with children under 5 years living in south Macomb County and northeast Detroit. With these services, parents and caregivers will further develop personal and family goals and further support will be provided to families. The project will serve 150 families and will have a vigorous evaluation component to help ensure top measure component outcomes.

### Additional Sites For Parent Services Added

The agency has recently started providing additional parent workshops and parent/child interactive learning groups in the cities of Eastpointe, Dearborn and an additional site on Detroit's east side. These specialized interactive groups and workshops will focus on infant and toddler development, nutrition, behavior concerns and social-emotional development. Both parents and childcare providers are welcome to access a wealth of information at these new sites.
