

Important notes about The Stephen J. Wampler Foundation

The Stephen J. Wampler Foundation was founded in late 2008 and received 501(c)(3) status from the IRS in February 2010. Steve originally founded Camp Wamp in 2002 but realized that there was a bigger picture to the overall story. From late 2008 to 2010, a new organization, The Stephen J. Wampler Foundation, was created. The financials enclosed reflect the original Camp Wamp at Hawley Lake. Camp Wamp continues on as a program of Wampler Foundation, while Wampler Foundation is a new organization with an extended mission to get as many kids out in wilderness and starting funding other program with camperships.

During the economic downtown, The Stephen J. Wampler Foundation's incoming grants and donations have decreased by about twenty percent. In late 2008, the organization decided to expand the mission statement and create The Stephen J. Wampler Foundation. While applying for a new status from the IRS for the expanded organization, fundraising efforts were significantly slowed.
