MEDICAL CASE MANAGEMENT

Case Management served 224 clients in 2009

- 99% were medically compliant
- 100% participated in the development of their Care Plans
- 94% improved in areas such as housing, mental health and substance abuse - thus being more self-sufficient.

RAIN's Medical Case Management Department saw a **87% increase** in clients needing services due to the closure of MAP (Metrolina AIDS Project) - *from Oct. 2009 to Jan. 2010*

- 325 calls were triaged and either placed in Case Management or Psychosocial Services.

DIRECT CLIENT SERVICES

RAIN staff and volunteers provided over 3,000 contacts to individuals living with HIV/AIDS as well as their friends and/or family. These personal contacts include home visits or hospital visits; transportation assistance to medical appointments, pharmacies, shopping, or social outings; and providing food or sharing a meal.

HIV/AIDS PREVENTION EDUCATION, AWARENESS AND ADVOCACY

Through such venues as *High Schools, Seminaries, Law Enforcement Agencies, Health Fairs, Red Ribbon Sundays, Sororities, and various activities in a number of congregations*, RAIN provided HIV/AIDS education, prevention, and awareness to 4,777 individuals.

VOLUNTEER ACTIVITY

RAIN trained and supervised over 500 volunteers to work directly with clients and also participated in community outreach, and fundraising events.

LONG TERM RESULTS


Since 1992, RAIN staff and volunteers have made an impact on hundreds of people:

- Provided over **149,500 units of service** to persons living with HIV/AIDS and their families
- Trained over **5,000 volunteers**
- Served over **750 individuals** living with HIV/AIDS
